Hello Vineyard Family,

It's official, the BC Provincial Health Office has lifted exemptions for all worshippers, which requires people to wear face coverings in public spaces. ***Effective Tuesday night, Nov 30th, all participants attending worship services must wear a mask.****

Masks can be removed for eating and drinking to allow for ceremonial services. Readers and celebrants can remove face coverings if they maintain physically distanced. Masks must be worn as participants come in to the place of worship and when they leave, until outside.

Provincial health officer Dr. Bonnie Henry also said places of worship can operate at full capacity if all participants are fully vaccinated. Otherwise, services are limited to 50 per cent of seated capacity. In our situation, where vaccination proof is NOT required, our limits will be set at 149 people in the service. Wouldn't that be a great problem to navigate?
